


b. Chile and Argentina - The authorities in both countries issued a red alert - the highest possible - saying the Chilean volcano could erupt imminently. They have ordered the evacuation of some 3,000 people living near the Copahue volcano in the south of their shared border
4. For what purpose should people in England dial 111?
d. Health non-emergency - Plans to launch a new NHS non-emergency helpline service in Wales look set to go ahead despite problems in England. The line is intended to allow access to services such as out-of-hours GPs, district nurses, and eventually social care too, so that people will be less likely to end up taking themselves off to hospital.
5. What did Sir Ben Ainslie achieve last week?
b. the fastest ever finish in the Round the Island yacht race at the Isle of Wight - Sir Ben Ainslie has dedicated his record-breaking effort in the Round the Island Race to fellow Olympic sailor Andrew Simpson, who died last month

b. they are going to freeze the ground - The government has ordered the operator of the nuclear plant to freeze the soil around its crippled reactor. Every day another 400 tonnes of groundwater forces its way into the plant, becomes contaminated with radioactivity and needs to be stored onsite.

a. a funfair - Twenty-five people were on the spinning ride - which lifts thrill-seekers off the ground to an almost vertical position - when it collapsed at the funfair in St Neots

c. Prince Harry - however, because of a law recently passed, when William and Kate Middleton have their first child later this year, the child will become third in line.
9. Security officials in the United States intercepted letters addressed to President Obama that contained what toxic substance?
a. ricin - The suspicious letter sent to US President Barack Obama is "similar" to two poisoned letters mailed to New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg this week. Ricin is one thousand times more toxic than cyanide, it can be fatal when inhaled, swallowed or injected, although it is possible to recover from exposure.
10. Which Premier League club has apologised to fans after making changes to the club's badge
c. Everton - The club's Latin motto Nil Satis, Nisi Optimum, which means "nothing but the best is good enough", and two wreaths have been removed from the new design. 22,000 fans signed a petition saying they would not buy merchandise with the new 'awful' crest.
